


Who We Are

Ensuring Success

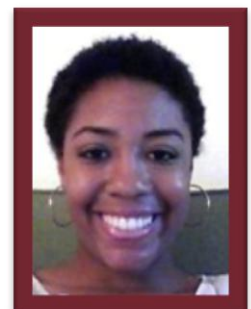
